### From My Heart to Yours...

An old fable imagines a handful of blind men positioned around an elephant. After taking a moment to explore with their hands the beast before them, each is asked to describe the elephant. Since one has a trunk, another a tail, another a tusk, and so on, however, they come up with very different descriptions of what an elephant is like.

This fable may be used for all sorts of mischief, but it does provide a helpful image: Namely, that some truths are larger and more complex than any one person can fully understand or adequately describe-like baptism, or Jesus on the cross, or resurrection. They are all concepts listed in the category called "MYSTERY." We can't fully understand or adequately describe what it all means, yet as we walk through this season called Lent and touch the water, bread and cup, and hear the stories of Jesus, we are immersed in a mystery that defines us.

On Palm Sunday we will sing "Hosanna," even as we prepare for the mystery of Christ's passion. On Holy Thursday we will gather around the Table, 12 people at a time, and remember Jesus' last meal with his disciples, as we leave the sanctuary in darkness and silence with our eyes turned towards the mystery of the cross. And Easter Sunday we will rejoice, as we celebrate baptism and confirmation with our babies and youth and embrace the mystery of resurrection!

We can't fully understand or adequately describe what it all means, yet somehow we know that through the mystery of water, bread and cup, and Jesus' life, death and resurrection, we will come to find new life!
