## Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday always falls on the Wednesday six and a half weeks before Easter, which is the day Jesus Christ was resurrected.

It is a solemn reminder of human mortality and the need for reconciliation with God and marks the beginning of the Lenten season.

It is a day of repentance when Christians confess their sins and profess their devotion to God.

Ash Wednesday gets its name from early traditions in the Christian Church in Rome, when penitents and sinners would partake in a period of public penance. They were sprinkled with ashes and dressed in a sackcloth until they were reconciled with church-goers on Maundy Thursday.
